

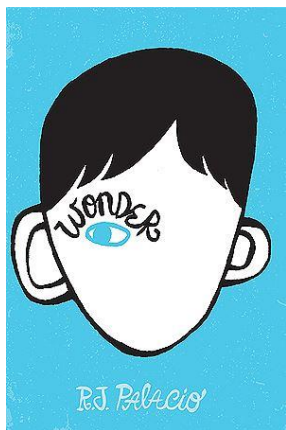

just like them, despite appearances?” (Goodreads)

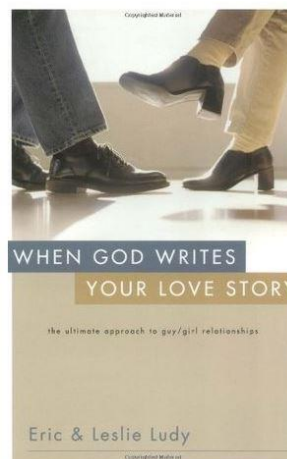
Elaine Parker (Circulation Manager): **When God Writes**
