Whether you're a veteran voter or a first-timer, the path to the General Election on **Tuesday, November 8**, has been a wild ride. As a library, we're committed to making sure you have access to the information you need. Below are common questions voters have, as well as resources that answer those questions.

I know about Hillary and Trump, but who's on the ballot for other offices (like the House of Representatives)?

If you go to www.Ballotpedia.org, you can pull up a voter's guide for your complete local ballot. It gives you the names of the candidates and measures, as well as a brief description of each stance. You can also go to www.OnTheIssues.org or the candidates' websites to research their platforms.

Where is my polling place?

Go to www.HeadCount.org and click on "Polling Place Finder." Or look up "where is my polling place" on Google.

What kind of photo ID do I need to bring?

Go to www.AlabamaVotes.gov/VoterID.aspx?a=Voters for a list of acceptable forms of ID.

I registered to vote, but what do I do if I don't appear on my polling place's list of voters?
